National Events

St. George's Golf and Country Club welcomed the 2022 RBC Canadian Open and debuted First Tee – Canada as the charitable beneficiary, which raised a total of over \$52,000 through the Golf Canada Foundation 50/50. Hundreds of families stopped by the First Tee Game Changers Pavilion which offered golf simulator lessons taught by a First Tee – Canada coach, a putting green, and more family-fun activities. Next to the Game Changers Pavilion was the championship putting green where children got up close to their favourite pros and had their First Tee autograph cards signed.

First Tee hosted the BGC Albion and BGC Peel for a behind-the-scenes tour of the RBC Canadian Open grounds and introduced children to the various career pathways that exist in golf such as the media centre, volunteer centre, and agronomy, environmental and sustainability teams.

The CP Women's Open was hosted at the Ottawa Hunt and Golf Club, where First Tee – Ontario activated and raised over \$39,500 in 50/50 ticket sales in support of First Tee – Ontario programming. During Wednesday's Championship Pro-Am round, local junior golfers walked alongside LPGA Tour professionals, and some even took the pros' first putts.

For Every Flower That Blooms:

First Tee – BC and Musqueam Golf and Learning Academy

Excerpt from Impact Story:

On traditional Musqueam First Nation territory alongside the Fraser River lies The Musqueam Golf and Learning Academy. This tree-lined golf course and driving range [in/near Vancouver, B.C.] is home to First Tee – British Columbia.

The name Musqueam relates back to the flowering plant, məθkwəỷ, which grows in the Fraser River estuary. Like flowers, children grow and develop in different ways, in a healthy, safe, enriching environment. By virtue of the land, the collaborative efforts of First Tee – BC, Musqueam Golf and Learning Academy, and the game of golf, for every flower that blooms, a child will too.

These kids have been using golf as an outlet, (and) feel a sense of inclusion and safety at the golf course. They never knew how much fun golf was and that it [can] help as a healthy escape from [a sometimes] not so healthy world. (To) get out of the house, and still be together as siblings, they found refuge here. They fell for the game... Through First Tee, we are supporting their development and providing for them as a community.

First Tee – British Columbia

In 2022, First Tee – British Columbia was active across eight golf courses, 18 schools, and 10 community centres, engaging over 10,000 children. Programming took place across 12 unique communities in Greater Vancouver, Vancouver Island, and the Okanagan regions. Participation levels were amongst the highest in the country with 71 percent of program spaces filled.

First Tee – British Columbia continued to strengthen its relationships with the Indigenous populations across the province, including the Musqueam, Squamish, Tsleil-Waututh, and Tk'emlúps te Secwepemc First Nations communities. Outreach to additional equitydeserving groups was achieved through connections made at the Greater Vancouver Food Bank, KidSport, the Canucks Autism Network, the Greater Vancouver Parks Board, and the District of Saanich Recreation Department.

First Tee – Ontario

First Tee – Ontario developed deeper relationships with partner institutions in 2022, including 10 golf courses, six schools, and eight community centres across the province. With the support of RBC Community Junior Golf, which provides free access to First Tee lessons at public and municipally owned courses, the majority of First Tee – Ontario participants accessed First Tee at no cost this year. In addition to addressing a barrier of affordability, First Tee – Ontario combatted an additional obstacle, transportation, and offered transportation services from community centres to local golf course locations.

Ontario was a hub of high-profile events including the RBC Canadian Open, the CP Women's Open, and the 2022 Canada Games. First Tee – Ontario leveraged its access to the RBC Canadian Open to engage with local community centres and invited youth groups to participate in event activations. The 2022 Canada Summer Games was hosted at a First Tee – Ontario on-course site, Legends on the Niagara. First Tee – Ontario was present and hosted golf clinics, collaborated with Special Olympics Ontario, and provided opportunities for children to walk alongside an athlete for a hole.

First Tee – Premier départ Québec

First Tee – Premier départ Québec proudly launched programming at six golf courses, 26 schools, and one community centre, engaging over 5,000 children across the province. The year's signature event, First Tee – Québec Cup, was held at Royal Montreal Golf Club and through a generous network of supporters raised nearly \$145,000.

First Tee – Premier départ Québec continues to grow its partnership with Centre Sportif CDN, which manages multiple community centres in the Montréal area serving traditionally marginalized groups. In addition, First Tee -Premier départ Québec has established relationships with Indigenous communities in Québec including the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake, Mashteuiatsh Reserve Cree, and the Nation of Waskaganish.

First Tee – Atlantic

First Tee – Atlantic launched in January 2022 and worked towards activating programming in all four Atlantic provinces. In partnership with Golf New Brunswick, Nova Scotia Golf Association, Prince Edward Island Golf Association, and Golf Newfoundland Labrador, First Tee – Atlantic onboarded two golf courses, 15 schools, and two community centres.

Notable partnerships for 2022 include the Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) EXCEL Program, which will help deliver First Tee – Atlantic to over 4,000 students at 69 sites through the school district's boundaries. Funding for this initiative was secured through a grant from HRCE EXCEL, which allowed First Tee – Atlantic to hire two, part-time Coaches to deliver the sessions. Other notable partnerships include a collaborative effort with the the Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq Nova Scotia, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Halifax, and recreation service providers in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.
