First Tee – Canada offers accessible and inclusive programming at golf courses, schools, and community centres, striving to ensure that the sport of golf reflects the diversity of Canadians.

Golf Canada partnered with First Tee in 2020 to launch First Tee – Canada and provide youth with affordable access to golf along with life-skill development opportunities through the game.

Paving an accessible pathway for junior golfers from coast to coast

Community Junior Golf

RBC Community Junior Golf is an initiative that accelerates the delivery of First Tee and Youth on Course programming at 34 municipal and accessible public golf courses across Canada.

RBC has proudly impacted more than 20,000 children since 2022.

First Tee programming at RBC Community Junior Golf sites is provided at no cost to participants and program administrators.

Canadian Tire Jumpstart

Jumpstart is supporting the launch of First Tee within 45 traditionally marginalized communities across Canada by 2024.

Canadian Tire Jumpstart's support of First Tee – Canada has put more clubs in the hands of youth from traditionally underrepresented backgrounds, uses golf as a platform to teach important life skills, and invites children to affordably play golf at accessible, inviting golf courses across Canada.

Through Canadian Tire Jumpstart's support, participants are recruited from local community centres and schools offering First Tee to attend nearby golf course programming to further their engagement in the sport. This creates an accessible pathway to junior golf participation, for those who otherwise may not have had the chance to play.

Making an Impact: **Introducing Golf to Newcomer Families**

A notable partnership from 2023 is the Winnipeg Newcomer Sport Academy, a sport organization offering programs to families as they adjust to their new communities. Most families within the organization arrived from Syria, Eritrea, South Africa, or Ukraine within the past five years, and now call Canada home.

The organization's participants were first introduced to First Tee programming at their summer multisport camp. Many of the participants continued with First Tee - Prairies programming by attending fall sessions at Golf Mentor Teaching Academy. Rain or shine, the participants showed up and were determined to practice their game and sharpen their skills.



Making an Impact: Giving Back Through Golf

Comité Jeunesse NDG has been a driving force in delivering impactful First Tee programming for youth in the Notre-Dame-de-Grace (NDG) borough of Montreal. In 2023, the organization offered the First Tee Community Program within dynamic summer camps and 'Try Golf' days catered to youth aged six to 12. The team ensured a meaningful presence across various community centres, parks, and schools within NDG.

For Coach and Director of Animation, Simeon Pompey, "The most impactful part of First Tee programming is the transferable life skills that are learned, [which are] very important for communities where golf is not seen as something that is accessible." With a strategic focus on reaching local youth from the same marginalized communities he grew up with in Montreal's West End, Pompey has been a dedicated proponent and practitioner of First Tee (US) since its inception in 1997. For his exceptional service and dissemination of First Tee across Comité Jeunesse's programming, Pompey was awarded the Lorie Kane Community Spirit Award from the Golf Canada Foundation.


