First Tee is Golf Canada's youth development program that uses golf as a vehicle to provide children with life-enhancing experiences. First Tee provides inclusive and low-barrier access to programming at golf courses, schools, and community centres, striving to ensure that golf reflects the strengths of Canada's multiculturalism.

Golf Canada partnered with First Tee in 2020 to launch First Tee – Canada. First Tee has since expanded to six regional chapters executing programming in every province across the country.



First Tee – Canada fully operational from coast to coast

I am extremely proud that First Tee – Canada continues to make a difference in the lives of youth in every province across Canada.

Golf participation in our country continues to reach multi-year highs and as the National Sport Organization, Golf Canada is focused on the long-term future and overall health of our sport.

Through First Tee – Canada, we are providing an accessible and affordable entry point to the game, especially for youth who may not have otherwise had the opportunity. To sustain and grow Canadian golf participation going forward, a larger share of golfers will reflect the strengths of multicultural Canada including groups historically underrepresented in our sport.

In 2024, First Tee – Canada programming was operational in every province across the country. In addition to this significant milestone, First Tee – Canada also surpassed 100,000 participants since its inception in 2020. This past year, First Tee – Canada provided programming to over 84,500 participants at 386 facilities (golf facilities, schools and community centres) led by 239 coaches across Canada. Seventy per cent of programming was offered at no cost to participants and nearly 75 per cent of partnered schools and community centres serve equity-deserving communities with 45 per cent of participants identifying as BIPOC and over 40 per cent identifying as female. This continued growth of First Tee – Canada will have a remarkable impact on the advancement of golf in this country.

The program's momentum and growth would not be possible without the Golf Canada Foundation and its network of passionate philanthropic champions, along with the many coaches, volunteers, and First Tee – Canada chapter staff across the country – thank you for your continued support of this special program.

Community Junior Golf

RBC Community Junior Golf is an initiative that supports First Tee and Youth on Course programming at 36 municipal and publicly accessible golf courses across Canada.

With nearly 100 dedicated coaches and 163 partnered community organizations, RBC's support has helped impact over 34,000 children through First Tee and Youth on Course – a 488 per cent increase since 2022 – with nearly 50 per cent of participants identifying as BIPOC.

All First Tee programming at RBC Community Junior Golf sites is provided at no cost to participants and program administrators.

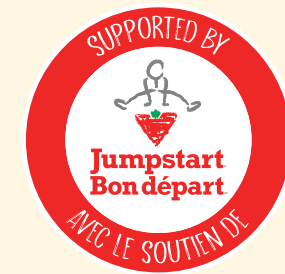


Canadian Tire Jumpstart

Making an Impact: Building Community Partnerships to Serve Equity-Deserving Youth

Since launching in 2021, First Tee – British Columbia has partnered with 21 community centres and youth organizations, including new partners this year, Big Brothers BC, KidsPlay Foundation, the Central Vancouver Island Multicultural Society (CVIMS), and the Extreme Outreach Society.

To amplify both new and ongoing partnerships, First Tee – British Columbia hosted nearly 50 introductory golf events this year for these community and youth organizations. These events are offered at no cost to participants and provide all the necessary equipment, serving as an impactful opportunity to introduce golf to children in a no-pressure, fun and inclusive environment.



The most rewarding part is seeing kids, who might not have initially been interested in golf, return week after week with enthusiasm and willingness to take on more challenges. The life skills they continue to develop through the program are invaluable and often more impactful than the golf skills themselves.

Making an Impact: A Successful Inaugural Season

In its first year of programming, First Tee – Alberta provided a diverse group of over 1,900 youth with low-barrier access to golf.

A highlight from the year was First Tee – Alberta's presence on site at the 2024 CPKC Women's Open, hosted at Earl Grey Golf Club in Calgary, AB.

The First Tee – Alberta staff raised over \$150,000 to support their chapter through a 50' Putt Challenge activation and a record-breaking 50/50 ticket raffle.

In addition, over 50 girls from the Calgary Immigrant Women's Association and Youth Centres of Calgary visited the tournament grounds for behind-the-scenes tours and First Tee clinics, where six LPGA professionals made special guest appearances. Nearly all participants were first-time golfers.

Making an Impact: Small Town, High Potential

In August 2023, the small town of Gladstone, MB partnered with First Tee – Prairies to create more accessible pathways to golf for youth and make a positive impact in their community.

The Westlake – Gladstone region has a population of 3,100 and faces unique challenges such as limited access to organized sports, proper equipment, and certified coaches.

Through First Tee, six schools in the Westlake – Gladstone region are delivering introductory golf programming to students through their physical education curriculum. Gladstone Golf and Country Club also offers registered on-course programming and hosts field trips for local schools and community organizations.

Although newer to the Prairies, First Tee has engaged over 22,000 youth since last summer across 40 program locations in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, while delivering 100 per cent of programming at no cost.

This is only the beginning of the lasting impact First Tee – Prairies aims to have on Gladstone and more rural communities.

First Tee – Ontario has continued to strengthen its allyship and existing bonds with Indigenous communities across the province to provide meaningful experiences to Indigenous youth through golf.

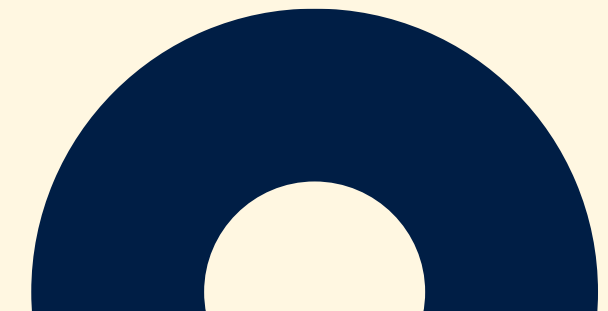
To date, First Tee – Ontario has partnered with nine Indigenous schools and community centres across the province, along with four golf courses including Roseland Golf Club, MontHill Golf and Country Club, Archies Family Golf Centre, and Briar Fox Golf Club, all serving Indigenous youth through on-course programming.

Since 2022, First Tee – Ontario has received generous support from Indigenous Sport and Wellness Ontario (ISWO). Through hosting events and advocating for First Tee within their network, ISWO's efforts have helped build awareness and onboard more program locations, ultimately providing more Indigenous youth with access to golf.

Making an Impact: Dedicated Golf Course Partners

Golf Saint-Prime sur le Lac partnered with First Tee – Premier départ Québec in 2021 to provide accessible pathways to golf and make a positive impact on youth in their community. Since launching, Golf Saint-Prime sur le Lac has engaged over 140 First Tee participants.

The program focuses on quality over quantity. Program registration sticks to a 1:6 coach to participant ratio, ensuring each participant is receiving attentive instruction to develop their skills.

Special to this location, all participants can put the skills they have learned to the test and experience two rounds of golf at a nearby 9-hole, par 3 course for no extra cost. As a result of Canadian Tire Jumpstart's generous support, First Tee – Premier départ Québec provides all participants with transportation from Golf Saint-Prime sur le Lac to the par 3 golf course.

Making an Impact: Girls in the Game

In 2024, First Tee - Atlantic recorded the highest percentage of female participants among the six First Tee - Canada chapters.

Over 8,000 young females in the Atlantic region were introduced to golf, representing more than half of the chapter's participant base, and over 90 per cent of participants were first-time golfers.

First Tee - Atlantic has prioritized female participation by hosting no-cost introductory golf events for girls aged five to 13. The events are hosted at golf courses across all four Atlantic provinces, led by a 16-woman roster of First Tee trained coaches.

At these events, participants learn more than how to chip and putt. In New Brunswick, after learning skills on the golf course, girls were led through a confidence building and female empowerment workshop, spearheaded by Meghan Beland at She is Active NB.

“That’s what sets First Tee apart from other junior golf programs or sports programs. We focus on building golf skills with a life skills integration, and we are striving to break down barriers to reach underrepresented groups, like females.”

- 72' Putt Challenge raised over **\$57,000**

 - Nearly 1,300 spectators attempted the putt with 23 winners taking home a new Scotty Cameron putter.
- **\$61,180** was raised in support of First Tee – Alberta from the tournament's 50/50 ticket raffle.
- The inaugural Audi Precision Award was presented to 2024 CPKC Women's Open Champion, Lauren Coughlin, resulting in a **\$25,000** donation by Audi to support First Tee – Alberta.
- Over **50** girls from the Calgary Immigrant Women's Association and Youth Centres of Calgary participated in First Tee clinics led by First Tee coaches and six special guest LPGA players.

BDO National Golf League

In 2023, Golf Canada launched the BDO National Golf League (NGL) to enhance the recreational league experience for players across Canada. As there is no direct registration fee to play in the NGL, participants are encouraged to support First Tee – Canada by donating to their local First Tee provincial chapter.

Completion allows individuals to coach First Tee to children ages 7-9.
- 4. Complete Level 2 First Tee Coach In-Person Training**
Completion allows individuals to coach children ages 10-13.
- 5. Complete Level 3 First Tee Coach In-Person Training**
Completion allows individuals to coach children ages 14-16.

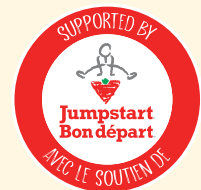
